Background to the Report

This executive summary outlines the main findings and recommendations from a community needs analysis of Tyrrelstown, which was completed in early 2020.

Tyrrelstown is one of the youngest, fastest growing and most diverse communities in the country. This brings with it a number of challenges for local residents, community groups, businesses and local services. This needs analysis was commissioned by Tyrrelstown Development Group to understand important issues for this growing community, and what can be done in the coming years. The perspective of local residents and stakeholders was core to achieving our research aims, which were:

- To understand issues or needs of most concern for people living in Tyrrelstown
- To gather feedback from local stakeholders on the underlying causes of issues
- To identify solutions or actions to effectively respond to identified issues
- To develop a series of recommendations for Tyrrelstown Development Group, with consideration for how changing Covid-19 restrictions may affect this work

Quality Matters, a research charity, in-partnership with Conor Ryan from Empower were asked by Tyrrelstown Development Group to undertake this research and to support development of recommendations.

What was the methodology?

- 1 Workshop with Tyrrelstown residents
- 2 Semi-structured phone interviews with local services and organisations in Tyrrelstown
- 3 Four focus groups with community residents and local community groups
- 4 Creation and distribution of online and on-street survey
- 5 Analysis of stakeholder feedback
- 6 Development of sociodemographic profile based on Census data and HP Deprivation Index
- 7 Workshop with Tyrrelstown Development Group and development of report recommendations

Tyrrelstown Development Group (TDG) was established in 2007 with a goal to bring local services and agencies together to understand and progress the needs of Tyrrelstown and its residents. In 2008, TDG with the support of its member agencies, commissioned its first research document "A Profile of the Needs of the Tyrrelstown Community". This research supported the formation of the Tyrrelstown Residents Association who along with the various groups, including TDG, were key to supporting the community to engage in important decisions about the Community.






DEMOGRAPHICS¹


AGE



GENDER




HIGHEST LEVEL OF EDUCATION

Recommendations

The full report contains 17 recommendations across four thematic areas that were developed collaboratively by the Tyrrelstown Development Group. This section is a summary of the recommendations, which are further detailed in the full report and available online. It is important to note that since the start of Covid-19, the Tyrrelstown Development Group has adjusted and refocused its plans to engage with local government, agencies and service providers. While we may not be able to meet, Tyrrelstown Development Group will make every effort with meet online and continue to engage virtually with local stakeholders until it is safe for this work to resume in-person.

The recommendations are summarised below:

1. IMPROVING EDUCATION

Improve educational supports for children and young people, as well as offer more alternative education options for adults in Tyrrelstown.

- Advocate for the development of a new secondary school in Tyrrelstown
- Work with Fingal County Childcare Network to deliver new afterschool activities
- Work with local youth and educational services to explore strategies for keeping young people in mainstream education
- Work with local training services to offer increased adult education courses
- Work with early years services to explore scope for additional pre-school places

2. INCREASING EMPLOYMENT

Improve supports for local businesses and increase the availability of employment supports for people who are not in employment, education or training.

- Partner with the Local Enterprise Office to promote engagement with businesses in Tyrrelstown
- Work with Intreo and Citizens Information Centres to offer employment supports in the local area

3. BUILDING A STRONGER COMMUNITY

Make Tyrrelstown a more social and safer community for the people who live here.

- Work with the local authority to attract more local businesses where residents can meet and socialise as well as support community/voluntary organisations to develop social enterprises where people can socialise locally
- Work with An Garda Síochána, Safer Blanchardstown and local community groups to promote awareness of existing forums and build connections between the Gardaí and the local community
- Develop a community calendar of local events and activities
- Help local clubs with accessing grant funding for sports and recreational activities
- Work with local representatives to set up political clinics for residents

4. ENHANCING INFRASTRUCTURE

Enhance local infrastructure for a growing population.

- Advocate for improved public transportation through Bus Connects
- Engage with Fingal County Council and An Garda Síochána to resolve parking/traffic issues in the area
- Work with Fingal County Council to improve lighting in local parks and green spaces
- Increase number of recycling facilities
- Explore possibility of bringing additional library services to Tyrrelstown
